The **EU Cities Mission** is a strategic initiative of the European Commission aimed at addressing some of the most pressing challenges facing Europe's cities. Its main objective is to support and promote the transformation of 112 European cities towards climate neutrality and sustainability by 2030. This Mission is framed within the **European Green Deal**, a key strategy for Europe's transition to a greener and more resilient economy.

PRINCIPLES OF THE EU CITIES MISSION

- **Climate neutrality**: reduce greenhouse gas emissions by promoting the use of renewable energy and improving energy efficiency in all urban sectors.
- Resilience and adaptation: improving the capacity of cities to mitigate and adapt to the impacts of climate change, such as heat waves, floods and other extreme weather events.
- Distributed leadership: implement distributed leadership that empowers local communities, organisations and governments to work together to make decisions and implement urban solutions.
- Gobernanza multinivel: Multi-level governance: fostering effective collaboration between all administrative levels - local, regional, national and European - to ensure coherent and coordinated implementation of urban sustainability policies and projects.
- **Citizen engagement:** actively involve citizens in the urban transformation process, ensuring that their voices and needs are considered.

The **implementation of the EU Cities Mission in Spain** aims to address challenges such as increasing the rate of energy retrofit, greening public spaces, the transition towards sustainable mobility and waste management. It also aims to promote social and economic cohesion, reducing inequalities.

The summer school 'Mission Possible: Creating the cities we want' is part of this context of urban transformation. Through this conference, participants will explore and work together to advance the EU Cities Mission in Spain, learning from practical examples, and developing key skills and knowledge to lead the change towards more sustainable, smart, inclusive and resilient cities, adopting collaborative governance practices, distributed leadership and multi-level collaboration.



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In this **third edition of the citiES 2030 summer school**, we are at a crucial point in the journey towards creating the cities we want. We have spent the last few years planning, building roadmaps and investment plans, and starting to collaborate. Every step we have taken, every learning and every challenge overcome have been small steps on our path to climate neutrality. Now, building on the achievements and knowledge gained, **we are better equipped** to tackle the challenges ahead.

These are the **key learnings** that will build the logbook for this journey

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POLITICAL COMMITMENT AND MULTI-LEVEL COLLABORATION

Political commitment at all administrative levels is crucial for the success of the Mission. Spanish cities have shown great leadership, which has been fundamental for the continuity of the initiatives since the beginning of the Mission. Collaboration among different cities and the integration of multiple stakeholders (public, private, civil society, academia and media) will be key elements to advance towards climate neutrality goals.



FUNDING AND RESOURCE MOBILISATION

Financial and human resources are essential for the implementation of the Mission. Continued support from the European Commission and sufficient resources to sustain the initiatives will be necessary. The Spanish Government has a crucial role to play, not only by providing resources and support, but also by providing a regulatory framework that favours systemic innovation and public-private collaboration. In the same way, private investment will be critical to the success of the Mission.



SUSTAINABLE AND JUST ENERGY RETROFIT

Energy retrofit requires a comprehensive approach that involves all key stakeholders and tackles fiscal, financial, regulatory and social barriers. Experience has shown that collaboration between citizens, government and the private sector can lead to sustainable solutions adapted to local needs. To achieve this, it will be essential to innovate in public policy and value chains, and to facilitate access to resources for the most vulnerable communities.





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CAPACITY BUILDING AND COLLABORATIVE GOVERNANCE:

The **creation of hybrid models of public policy and capacity building** in public administration will be crucial for the success of the EU Cities Mission. The development of collaborative spaces between all stakeholders and the promotion of distributed leadership will be essential to develop and implement policies towards climate neutrality.



INNOVATION AND ADAPTATION:

Integrating social change, climate change and administrative innovation perspectives has been identified as a pressing need. It is crucial to foster the creation of value propositions that are inclusive and participatory, democratising knowledge and promoting effective collaboration between public, private, scientific and civic sectors.



STRENGTHENING TRUST AND COMMUNITY WORK:

Strengthening interpersonal relationships and creating a network of mutual support among cities are essential ingredients to address the challenges of the Mission. Experience has shown us that an engaged and collaborative community can better cope with the uncertainty and challenges associated with the transition to sustainable and resilient cities.



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This year's programme will focus on **five key themes**. First, we will reinforce **political commitment** to ensure the continuity and success of the Mission. Next, we will address **strategic communication** to effectively engage citizens and other stakeholders. Also, we will focus on **capacity building**, developing essential skills and knowledge. We will also explore **financing for multi-city projects**, ensuring adequate resources. Finally, we will look more deeply into **energy retrofitting** to move forward on projects such as **URBANEW** and **EU CINCO 2.0**. This programme aims to provide tools and knowledge to advance the implementation of the Mission.



 action, training, learning, capacity building and collaboration processes, innovation
 processes in public policy, public procurement and value chains will be promoted.
